Live-Streamed Gubernatorial Candidate Forum Set for Wednesday

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – As candidates vie for control of the Governor's Office, local elected leaders and citizens throughout the state want to know where they stand on key issues impacting Florida's municipalities and their residents. Luckily, they'll have the perfect opportunity to hear about that and more at an upcoming candidate forum this Wednesday, August 15 at the Diplomat Hotel in Hollywood.

The Florida League of Mayors, in cooperation with the Florida League of Cities and Leadership Florida, is hosting the forum. Steve Vancore, president of VancoreJones and Clearview Research, will be moderating the discussion.

Each participating candidate will have 15-20 minutes to speak to the audience, made up of elected and appointed municipal officials, Leadership Florida members, members of Florida's press corps and others, followed by a 10-15 minute question-and-answer period.

"This is an opportunity for citizens and local officials to speak directly to these candidates and have their questions answered," said Tallahassee City Commissioner and Florida League of Cities President Gil Ziffer. "With the state's history of undermining local decision-making and hamstringing municipal officials from doing the jobs they were elected to do, it's important to know where the next leader of our state stands on local governance and their position on issues impacting residents and their communities."
