

Summary of March 27, 2023, FLC Monday Morning Call-In

David Cruz Update:

- [HB 401](#) (Beltran) and [SB 604](#) (Gruters) **Sovereign Immunity – Oppose** – Neither bill will be heard in a committee this week. HB 401 is in the House Appropriations Committee and has two committee stops left. SB 604 has not yet been heard in a committee. It has three committee stops. The first committee stop is the Senate Judiciary Committee. The next time the Senate Judiciary Committee meets is April 4.

Jeff Branch Update:

- [HB 671](#) (Esposito) and [SB 682](#) (DiCeglie) **Residential Building Permits – Oppose** – HB 671 will be heard on Tuesday, March 28 at 2:00 p.m. in the House Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Committee. This is the first of three committee stops in the House. SB 682 has three committee stops and is still in its first committee of reference.

Rebecca O’Hara Update:

- [HB 23](#) (Bell) and [SB 162](#) (Collins) **Water and Wastewater Facility Operators – Support** – HB 23 will be heard today, March 27, at 2:00 p.m. in the House Infrastructure Strategies Committee. This is the final committee stop in the House. SB 162 will be heard on Wednesday, March 29 at 12:00 p.m. in the Senate Regulated Industries Committee. This is the second of three committee stops in the Senate.
- [HB 975](#) (Holcomb) and [SB 798](#) (Ingoglia) **Solid Waste Management – Oppose** – HB 975 passed its first committee of reference, the House Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, on March 20. The next committee stop is the House Civil Justice Subcommittee. HB 975 is not on the committee agenda for this week. SB 798 has three committee stops and has not yet been heard in a committee. It is possible the bills could be heard next week.
- [HB 1331](#) (Busatta Cabrera) **Municipal Utilities – Oppose** – HB 1331 passed the House Energy, Communications & Cybersecurity Subcommittee on March 21. HB 1331 has one committee stop remaining, the Commerce Committee. A similar bill, [SB 1380](#) (Martin), was temporarily postponed last week in the Senate Regulated Industries Committee. This is the first of three committee stops in the Senate. Neither bill is scheduled to be heard this week. It is possible SB 1380 could be heard on April 4 in the Senate Regulated Industries Committee.

Tara Taggart Update:

- [SB 998](#) (Burgess) and [HB 935](#) (Jacques) **Police Chiefs – Oppose** – SB 998 will be heard today, March 27, at 3:00 p.m. in the Senate Criminal Justice Committee. This is the first of three committee stops in the Senate. HB 935 will be heard on Tuesday, March 28 at 2:00 p.m. in the House Constitutional Rights, Rule of Law & Government Operations Subcommittee. This is the first of three committee stops in the House.

- [HB 833](#) (Duggan) and [SB 714](#) (DiCeglie) **Vacation Rentals – Monitor** – HB 833 will be heard on Tuesday, March 28 at 2:00 p.m. in the House Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Subcommittee. This is the first of three committee stops in the House. SB 714 has two more committee stops in the Senate and will not be heard in a committee this week.
- [SB 1708](#) (DiCeglie) and [HB 1511](#) (Giallombardo) **Cybersecurity – Monitor** – SB 1708 will be heard on Wednesday, March 29 at 8:30 a.m. in the Senate Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee. This is the first of four committee stops in the Senate. HB 1511 passed its first committee of reference on March 21 and has two more committee stops in the House.

Charles Chapman Update:

- [SB 1604](#) (Ingoglia) and [HB 439](#) (McClain) **Land Use and Development Regulations – Oppose** – SB 1604 has three committee stops and is still in its first committee of reference, Senate Community Affairs. It is not on this week's committee agenda, but we will watch to see if it is on the April 5 committee agenda. HB 439 has two more committee stops in the House. The next stop is the House Commerce Committee. It is not on this week's committee agenda and the committee is not scheduled to meet the week of April 3rd.
